# "THINGS ABOUT FORGIVENESS"

- I. Forgiveness is not forgetting. Forgetting is a long-term by-product of forgiveness, but it is never a means toward it. Don't put off forgiving those who have hurt you, hoping pain will go away. Once you choose to forgive someone, Jesus will heal your wounds. WE DON'T HEAL IN ORDER TO FORGIVE; WE FORGIVE IN ORDER TO HEAL.
- 2. Forgiveness is a choice, a decision of the will. God requires you to forgive; it is something you can do. Some people hold on to their anger as a means of protecting themselves against further abuse, but all they are doing is hurting themselves. Others want revenge. Let God deal with the person. As long as you refuse to forgive someone, you are still hooked to that person and what they did. You're still chained to your past and tied up in bitterness. By forgiving you let the other person off your hook, but he or she is not off God's hook. What you gain by forgiving is freedom from your past and those who have hurt you. The other person involved may or may not want that same freedom of being lifted out of the muck. If the other person wants to stay back in the muck, you can't very well force them to leave it. TO FOR-GIVE IS TO SET A CAPTIVE FREE AND THEN REALIZE YOU WERE THE CAPTIVE.
- 3. Forgiveness is agreeing to live with the consequences of another person's sin. We all will live with the consequences of someone else's sin. The only choice is whether you will live with the consequences in the bondage of bitterness or in the freedom of forgiveness. THE CROSS MAKES FOR-GIVENESS MORALLY RIGHT.
- 4. Forgiveness is choosing not to hold someone's sin against him or her anymore. When you're bitter it's common to bring up past wrongs with those who have hurt you. Many times it is done out of revenge to try and make them feel as bad as you do. That's going back into the muck again. YOU CAN TAKE A STAND AGAINST THE WRONG WHILE EXERCISING GRACE AND FORGIVENESS.
- 5. Don't wait until you feel like forgiving. You may never get there. Forgiving is a step of faith not feeling. SAY, "LORD, I CHOOSE TO FORGIVE THEM AND WHAT THEY DID TO ME."


